FROM THE EDITOR

Season Ends for Most Alberta Flowing Water - Indoor Season Starts

With most of the streams in Alberta closed on October 31 and, with few exceptions, the remainder closing soon by ice cover, it's time to turn our fishing interest to indoor activity. For many of us, that means fly tying, reading and videos. The Northern Lights Fly Tyers meetings are excellent places to reduce those fishing withdrawal symptoms. Bob Guidos and his elves are well on the way to having most of the winter program organized. Unfortunately my attendance at meetings this year will likely be sporadic due to rehearsals for the choir I'm in moving to Wednesday evenings. I'll make as many NLFT meetings as I can though.

Our October program consisted of four sessions. It began October 5th with Brian Hepperlie making his return as a presenter with a demo of a Royal Humpy. We continued on the 12st with Paul Fitt showing us a golden stone pattern which, unlike some of his others, is actually fishable. October 28th we had a free tye and BS session. And on the 26th Dan Tulik showed us some scud patterns. Thanks go to all the presenters for a month well done.

The most important NLFT event in November is our Fall Fundraiser and Silent Auction at the St Albert Curling Club on November 5th. Tickets sales for the dinner are closed, but if you want to come for the Auction only, please let Ken Monk know by November 2nd. so we know to expect you. We have lots of auction items available. Current projections are for about 80 attendees, so come prepared to bid high and often.

We will have five meetings in November at Queen Mary Park. The first meeting is November 2nd with Bob Guidos demonstrating a Swan Lake Boatman and Zug Bug. We continue on November 9th where we have Gord Boutette demonstrating a West Coast Salmon Fly. Then on November 16th well have Peter Little discussing Stillwater Adaptations. Week four on the 23rd Jim O'Neill and Jessica Reilly bring us the results of the Pembina Grayling Survey. And finally for the month, on November 30th we get Emmerson Dober giving us demonstrations of a couple of Subsurface Flies. It will be a busy month of information filled meetings.

We have one other event in November, and that's an in-store Kids Tying outreach event at Cabellas on Saturday, November 19th. We'll be manning tables in the fly fishing section of the store from 11am to 3pm. Superfly has offered us materials and we have our own vices and equipment to support the event. What we need now is four to six volunteers. So if you done kids tying at the Sportsman's' and Outdoor shows, then consider adding this you your resume. As those folk can testify teaching kids to tye their firs fly can be a fun and rewarding experience. You need not be an expert to help out. The fly we tye is pretty basic, so even if you've not helped with kids tying before, it's an easy gig. If you can volunteer, then please let any executive member know. We'll also have a sign-up sheet at meetings.

Our Annual General Meeting will be held on January 18th, 2012. This is when we hear executive reports and elect club officers. This is also the one time per year when we can make changes to the Club Charter. In order to do so, proposed changes must be published in the December Newsletter The deadline for such submissions to that newsletter is November 21st.

And last for this month is another reminder of our upcoming January Seminar. This stellar event features the Dynamite Duo of Jack Dennis and Phil Rowley on January 21st and 22nd. We'll have tickets available later in November and poster sand tickets will be in the local shops well before Christmas. It will be two great days with two entertaining pros. More details on program and costing to come.
