<b>WEDNESDAY 7 MARCH</b>	<b>TYER:</b> DAVE MURRAY  <b>PATTERN:</b> WOOLY BUGGER  <b>HOOK:</b> MUSTAD 9672 OR 9673 SIZE 10 THROUGH 16.  <b>TAIL:</b> MARIBOU ALMOST ANY COLOR WITH STRANDS OF FLASH.  <b>THREAD:</b> 6/0 OR 8/0 YOUR CHOICE OF COLOR  <b>UNDERBODY:</b> IF USED WOOL TO APPROX. MATCH BODY COLOR.  <b>BODY:</b> RABBIT PLUS DUBBING OR MEDIUM CHENILLE, NEARLY ANY COLOR..  <b>HACKLE:</b> SOFT WEBBY HEN HACKLES, 2 TO 3 DEPENDING ON HACKLE QUALITY AND LENGTH. (A QUITE LARGE NUMBER OF HACKLE TURNS ARE USED AND THE HACKLE IS A LITTLE OVERSIZED TO MAKE MORE MOVEMENT POSSIBLE).  <b>TYING NOTE:</b> SOMETIMES HACKLES OF DIFFERENT COLORS ARE USED WHEN TYPING THIS FLY. LIGHT COLOR ON THE BACK AND DARK ON THE FRONT. SOMETIMES THE COLORS ARE MIXED TOGETHER. AN INTERESTING VARIANT IS TO DUB THE BODY OVER A WOOL UNDER- BODY.  <b>THIS FLY HAS BEEN CALLED THE BREAD AND BUTTER OF PROSPECTING FLYS.</b>
