Hook: Mustad 9671 10-12 or equivalent

Thread: Brown

Body: Embroidery floss: light tan (100% cotton from

the crafts section of your favorite store)

Back: Pheasant tail
Legs: Brown goose biots

Bubble: Mylar tinsel

Comments: The first pattern was David Phelps's suggestion for Dolberg Lake, and I had success with it on Hasse Lake as well. The other one is a work in progress and is the result of tinkering with boatman patterns.
