MARCH 6

Topic: Fly Fishing and Tying Supplies Sale

Comments: This is our first try at a kind of "swap meet". It's an opportunity to get some good stuff cheap, cheap, cheap; particularly for those new to the sport. It's also a chance for those of us with too much junk to clean out the basement. Many members have brought in their surplus equipment and materials for sale to other members. The club will take only a very a small percentage of the sale price. So come early and bring lots of loonies.

Program Corner 1: The Roll Cast

Comments: Brian Hepperle will demonstrate the roll cast, which is very useful for getting that fly out when there's a flyeating tree behind you.

Program Corner 2: Stacking Hair

Comments: Gord Boutette will give you the secret tips to when and how to stack hair for those wonderful, but tricky patterns that call for stacked deer or elk hair.

Tyer: Gord Boutette
Pattern: Elk Hair Caddis

Hook: Mustad #94831 dry fly – size 10 to 16

Thread: Tan 6/0 Rib: Fine gold wire

Hackle: Clipped light brown saddle hackle Body: Tan Anton or rabbit dubbing

Wing: Stacked Elk Hair

Comments: This reliable and versatile dry fly pattern will follow up on the program corner technique.

March 20

Tyer Dennis Southwick Pattern: Blue Winged Olive

Hook: Mustad #94831 dry fly #12 to #18

Thread: Olive 6/0

Tail: Moose hair or micro fibbets

Body: Olive polypropylene or rabbit dubbing

Wing Post: Grey Anton

Hackle: Blue dun saddle or neck hackle, parachute style **Comments:** *This common mayfly is a staple on many Alberta streams.*

Tyer Dave Phelps Pattern: *Prince Nymph*

Hook: Mustad #9672 wet fly #10 to #16

Bead Gold or silver bead, sized to hook

Thread: Black 6/0

Tail:Brown stretch flossRib:Fine gold wireBody:Peacock herlWing:White stretch flossHackle:Soft brown hen

Comments: This nymph is one of the most productive searching patterns on many Alberta streams. Grayling just love it! Usually tied with goose biots instead of stretch floss.

March 27

Program Corner 1: The Reach Cast

Comments: Brian Hepperle will demonstrate the reach cast, which is essential if you want to avoid drag on those cross-stream presentations.

Program Corner 2: Posts for Parachutes

Comments: *Michael Dell will show you how to set up a wing post for parachute hackles.*

Tyer Michael Dell

Pattern: *Letort Hopper with Legs* **Hook:** Mustad #94831 dry fly #8 to #12

Thread: 6/0 yellow

Body: Yellow dubbing or Polypropylene

Rib: Tying Thread

Legs: Baler Twine – Michael will supply

Underwing: Mottled turkey **Overwing:** Deer Hair

Comments: This is a reliable grasshopper pattern that works

well in late summer
