**Hook:** #12 – 16 continuous curve nymph TA-ST163C

**Thread:** Black 8/0 Unithread **Rib:** extra fine copper wire

**Body:** wine super stretch floss & pearl crystal flash

Thorax: Peackock herl

Pattern: Ice Cream Cone

**Hook:** #12 - 16 continuous curve nymph or dry hook

**Thread:** Black 6/0 Danville

**Bead:** white xs bead (14 and smaller) red extra fine copper wire

**Body:** black super stretch floss or color to suit

**Comments:** Robert will discuss midge construction and how to fish these tiny hatches that occur throughout the year. He will also discuss a variety of new products that are available for fly tyers
