## **Busy Part of the Club Tying Season Upon Us**

Thread: UTC 140 Tan or Olive Tail: Blue Dun fibers

Body: Dubbing, gray or olive mixed with tan

Wing: Blue dun hackle tips Thorax: Same as body Hackle: Blue dun hackle

**Comments:** I think this is Dan's first Demo. He's chosen an old standby that should form a part of every fly fisher's dry-fly box. Go to it Dan!
