PATTERN DEMONSTRATION

Tyer: Dan Tulik
Pattern: Coyote

Hook: #12 or smaller dry

Thread: Black 6/0

Tail: natural deer hair (short length)

Body: red yarn or floss

Wing: natural deer hair (short length)

Hackle: grizzly and brown (gap size and larger)

Comments: Dan will tie up an attractor pattern for us.

OCTOBER 8TH

OSTRICH HERL FLIES

Tyer: Doug Cockwill
Pattern: Gilled Nymph

Hook: TMC 200R #12 to #18

Thread: Black 6/0 Rob: Fine wire

Body: Gray Ostrich Herl
Wing Case: Plastic Bag
Thorax: Gray dubbing
Legs: Partridge hackle

Pattern: Ostrich Caddis

Hook: TMC 2302 #12 to #16

Thread: Black 6/0

Body: Clear larva lace and

gray and white ostrich herl

Thorax: Hare's ear dubbing Wing Case: Clear plastic

Comments: Doug will show us a couple of patterns that take advantage of the characteristics of this material.

PATTERN DEMONSTRATION

Pattern: CDC Blue Winged Olive
Hook: Dry Fly #18 to #22

Thread: Olive 8/0

Wing: 2 natural dun CDC tips, divided Tail: blue dun or light colored hackle tips

Body: olive CDC dubbed

Comments: This pattern comes via Vic Bergman to Jim McLennan. Michael will demonstrate how to tie up a fly we see on the water often, but in sizes we normally don't try to tie.

OCTOBER 15TH PROGRAM CORNER

Topic: Rigging for Fly Fishing
