FROM THE EDITOR

Tying Season in Full Swing!

The main fishing season here is drawing to a close. The Red Deer and McLeod Rivers have produced Rockies and some Grayling for those intrepid anglers tough enough to head out in colder weather. There may still be a lake or two without ice for part of this month so I'd expect a few reports of late season lunkers caught. Keep your eye on the club Bulletin Board for hints of outings. Once the ice comes and gets thick enough (usually later in December) there may even be a few hardy ice fishers going out. Just make sure there's 4" of ice first.





Speaking of the Red Deer River, as noted in my post to the Club BB, the "Bobber Pool" claimed another couple of victims last month. John and Lance fell victims to slippery rocks and found out why wader belts are required equipment. Remember to be careful wading and now that cooler weather makes a ducking a more serious proposition, be sure to carry a safety kit containing some matches, a power bar and maybe a dry shirt in a zip-lock bag. Hypothermia can be a killer.

Also on the Red Deer, please make sure before wading that you're not going to step into Brown Trout Redds. Look for lighter patches of gravel. We don't want to disturb the next generation of fish.

With winter just around the corner, its time to start stocking up those boxes for next spring, tying ice fishing flys, or perhaps tying a bunch of flies as Christmas presents for that angler on your list. Our Club's indoor activity is now in full swing, so come out and tie a few or just listen to the varied fishing talks. Once again we have patterns to suit a variety of fishing occasions and tying skills with a Woolly Bugger demonstration by father and daughter Cattroll and an Advanced Caddis pattern by Don Johnston. We also have some topics of general interest to fly fishers with Hopper-Dropper Technique by Brian Hepperle (absolutely essential for fishing the Red Deer) and a GPS Device presentation by Wayne Richie to help keep you from getting lost. Remember to bring your loonies for the 50/50 draw and don't be shy about joining some of us for a beverage at the Ritchie Mill afterwards.

The Trout Unlimited winter program is also going strong. See the box at the bottom of the page for info on the next meeting.

Pattern: Spent Sedge

Hook: Daichi Size 14, to 16, 2X long

Thread: Brown 8/0 or 170

Abdomen: Nymph skin, organza wrapping ribbon

Legs: English Deer Hair and CDC

Wing: Ladies Panty Hose
Thorax: Designer Skin
Antennae: Porcupine guard hair

Pens: Prismacolor or chart pack – ocher, leaf green,

dark brown, blender

Comments: These are advanced, realistic patterns

using some interesting techniques.
