Dennis Southwick Tyer: Pattern: Chernobyl Ant

Hook: Streamer, 2x to 3x long, #6 to #12

Red 6/0 Thread:

Body: Tan closed cell foam

Glue: Zap a Gap or similar instant glue

Rubber hackle Legs:

Comments: This is Dennis' "go to" pattern when things get tough. He will show a simple attachment technique for the rubber legs.

Pattern: Foam Emerger

Dry Fly # 10 to #16 Tiemco 100 or 9300 Hook:

Olive 6/0 Thread: Trailing Shuck: Brown antron Body: Pheasant tail Rib: Copper wire Wing Case: Tan closed cell foam

PMD dubbing (light yellow antron) Thorax:

Natural CDC puff Wing:

Comments: This is one of Jack Dennis' patterns. The low profile matches an emerging insect.

Loop Foam Fly Pattern:

Thread: Black 6/0

Body: Foam – color to suit Underwing Mirage Accent Wing: Elk Hair Head: Black foam Legs: Rubber Hackle

Comments: Another foam pattern to learn more foam
