FROM THE EDITOR

Spring Still A Ways Off, But A Busy Month Ahead!

The TU dinner is on April 29th at the Westin. So here's another reminder to start contributing to our annual donation of flies. Also, Michael Dell is looking for volunteers to assist with various activities at the dinner. If you want to help trout conservation, give Michael a call.

We're taking names for the April 17th Beginner's Fly Tying Session. This is a hands-on day of introduction to the basics. The venue has been moved from Jasper Place High (undergoing renovations) to NAIT (Thanks to Dave Murray). We try to make the instruction one-on-one using club volunteers. If you want to help with that, or just attend and learn a thing or three, leave your name with Scott Campbell or Ron Hagen. Ron will be looking for volunteers at the next few meetings to bag materials for the various patterns. The advanced fly tying session will be May 1st, so we still have a bit of time to organize, but if you are interested in that one please let Scott or Ron know.

Organizing for our Casting Clinics is in the early stages. The Beginners Clinic goes April 25th at Robert Rundle School in St. Albert, starting at 10 am for a full day of instruction. The Intermediate Clinic goes June 5th at Rundle Park with casting to be on the river, so you will need a fishing license for it. We'll keep you informed about that as things get set up.

"The Iron Fly Tyer" is going this month. The Iron Fly Tyer Event (with apologies to the Iron Chef of Food Channel fame) will take place at the regular club meeting on Wednesday April 7. (Appropriately enough, about a week after April Fools). The event is a fly tying competition, with the winner earning the title of "Iron Fly Tyer" to be held (in great esteem and respect) until the next event.

I've three competitors, one each in the following categories, to be introduced at the event: Iron Tyer - Dry Fly, Iron Tyer - Wet Fly, Iron Tyer - Nymphs. Each contestant will be required to tie three flys, one in each of the Iron Tyer categories, in a total time period of one hour, using their own materials and equipment, but each incorporating a "mystery" material that I will unveil at the event. Spectators are encouraged to participate by offering helpful suggestions, guesses on the nature of the finished product, and critiques on the use of material and technique, to the camera team that will be recording the event for posterity.

After tying, the flys will be judged by a panel of experts. Judging will take place during coffee break and 50/50 sales The winner gets the title "Iron Fly Tyer" with which goes the tremendous admiration of club members, bragging rights until the next event and a high quality trophy to be displayed in their honor at club meetings. This should be a hoot!

Patterns: One each dry fly, wet fly and nymph

Hook: Dry fly #12, wet fly #8, nymph #10

Special Material: Surprise!

Comments: The competitoirs will use their own materials to construct at least three flys in a one-hour time frame. A special "surprise" material will be given out at the start of tying that the participants will have to incorporate it into each fly. The flys will be judged on: Overall appearance, Quality of the tying techniques, Originality, Best use of the Mystery Material and Potential fish catching ability The winner earns the coveted title of "Iron Fly Tyer" until the next competition.

Pattern: Tellico Nymph
Hook: Nymph #10 to #16

Thread: Yellow uni-stretch & black/brown 8/0

Body: Yellow uni-stretch
Tail: Brown hackle fibres
Rib: Peacock herl

Hackle: Brown hen or soft hackle

Comments: Michael will demonstrate a novel nymph

pattern that uses stretch floss.

Pattern: Soft Hackle Red Tag
Hook: Wet #8 to #14
Thread: Black or brown 6/0

Head: Gold bead Tail: Red llama

Body: Bright green special llama

Rib: Gold or silver

Hackle: Brown

Pattern: Llama Leech

Hook: Streamer #4 to #12
Thread: Black or brown 6/0
Head: Dumbbell eyes
Tail: Red llama
Body: White llama
Rib: Silver
Thorax: Red llama

Hackle: White or red and yellow llama streamer

Comments: Keith will demonstrate two effective patterns for the local ponds and lakes that make use of the llama fur that he and Dennis have available.

Hook 2X curved nymph #8 to #14
Body: Tan and brown foam

Underbody: Amber or red crystal chenille

Legs: Sillilegs

Underhead: Red or olive dubbing

Rib: Dun Hackle Strike Indicator: Yellow yarn

Comments: Dave will demonstrate a couple of durable and

successful foam based patterns.
