PATTERN DEMONSTRATION

Tyer: Dennis Southwick
Pattern: Griffith's Gnat
Hook: Dry Fly #12 to # 18

Thread: Black 6/0
Body: Peacock herl
Hackle: Grizzly hackle

Comments: This is a simple to tie but effective all round attractor fly. Deadly for Arctic Grayling.

Tyer: Dennis Southwick
Pattern: Parachute Adams
Hook: Dry Fly #12 to # 18

Thread: Tan 6/0
Tail: Moose Mane
Body: Light Grey Dubbing
Wing Post: White Antron
Hackle: Grizzly hackle

Comments: Dennis has a new parachute technique to show us that he says makes tying them very easy.

SEPTEMBER 22ND

Topic: Haa Nee Naa Lodge Trip

Presenter: Dave Robinson

Comments: Dave went on one of those "trips of a lifetime" with fellow members John Bertrand and Wayne Rogers to fly fish for Coho Salmon at Haa Nee Naa Lodge north of Prince Rupert. He'll give a slide show if he can get organized in time.

Tyer: Dave Robinson
Pattern: Clouser Minnow

Hook: Stainless Saltwater Hook # 2

Thread: Clear 6/0
Eyes: Dumbell Eyes
Underbody: Pearl Braid
Lower Wing: White Polar Bear
Flash: Green Krystal Flash
Upper Wing: Chartreuse Yak Hair

Comments: the fly that accounted for most of the salmon on Dave's trip. It's also an effective bull trout and pike fly, once you learn how to cast it.

SEPTEMBER 29TH

Topic: Patterns for Rockies on the Red Deer River

Presenter: Paul Fitt

Pattern: Bead Head Prince Nymph

Hook: Mustad C49S curved Caddis #14 and #12

Thread: Black 6/0 or 8/0
Bead: 1/8 Gold Tungsten
Tail: Brown Goose Biots
Rib: Fine Gold Wire
Butt: Orange Dubbing

Body: Pheasant color Arizona Diamond Dub

Wing Case: White Goose Biots Thorax: Peacock herl

Comments: Different look to an old standby. If time

permits Paul will also tie a Nutria Nymph.
