Tyer: Les Campbell Pattern: Bull Trout Flies

Hook: Mustad 79480 (4x) - #2 to #6 and

Mustad 340007 - #2 to #0

Bead: Large cone head Leader: 20 lb wire Weight .025 lead wire

Tail: Rabbit strips (wide) white & yellow

Hackle: Grizzly – yellow & white

Accent: Crystal Flash

Wing: Deer hair or Bucktail, long – white, black &

yellow

Iron Fly Tyer: Michael Dell Challengers: Lance Taylor

Patterns: Dry fly, Wet fly and Nymph Hook: Dry #12, Wet #8, Nymph #10

Material: Surprise!

Format: The competitors will use their own materials and equipment to construct at least three flys in a one-hour time frame. A special "surprise" material will be given out at the start of tying that the participants will have to incorporate it into each fly. The flys will be judged on: Appearance, Tying Techniques, Originality, Best Use of Mystery Material and Potential Catching Ability The winner earns the coveted title of "Iron Fly Tyer" until the next competition.

Comments: The smash success of last year returns with Michael Dell defending his title against two challengers: Lance Taylor (aka Ranger Bob also aka Spongebob Wetpants) and Dale Johnston (a founding NLFT member who has rejoined the motley crew). Each will test their tying skill against Master Dell in a trio of patterns. Come prepared to be amazed (and to heckle).

PATTERN DEMONSTRATION

Tier: Robin McKinley
Pattern: Quick Descent Nymph
Hook: curved nymph 10-16

Tail: Partridge

Body: Quick Descent dubbing (any 'nymphy' colour)

Over body: Micro-tubing

Wing case: Flashback (colour to match body)
Thorax: Peacock over Quick Descent dubbing

Legs: Partridge

Pattern: Steely's Nightmare

Hook: Big and Long Undertail: Flashy stuff

Tail: Pink Magnum Rabbit strip Body: Black or Purple chenille Hackle: Black or Purple Shlappen Eyes: Dumbbell eyes or cone

Comments: Robin (aka Silver Hilton) says his Steely's

Nightmare also works as a pike fly.
