### PATTERN DEMONSTRATION

Tier: Michael Dell Pattern: Catatonic Leech

Hook: #10 to #12 - 2xl Nymph

Thread: Black or olive

Weight: Lead wire or lead substitute

Tail Olive Marabou

Body: Olive Marabou, dubbed

Comments: Michael will demo a pattern that we found out last week works exceptionally well at Dolberg, at least for Stu, who seemed to have mastered the lake.

# JUNE 8TH

#### **PATTERN DEMONSTRATION**

Tier: Rod Boisvert
Pattern: Yellow Sally

Hook: 3xl Mustad 9672 # 12 through #8

Thread: Pale yellow 6/0 or 8/0

Tail: Red egg ball, yellow holographic tinsel or yarn

Body: Pale yellow-olive fur or antron dubbing

Wing: Bleached Deer hair (creamy white) or light elk

Hackle: Light ginger

**Comments:** After an absence of a few months, Rod returns to Northern Lights and immediately chips in with a seasonal pattern demonstration. Come out and tye along with and welcome Rod back.

Tier: Dennis Southwick

Pattern: CDC Stone and CDC Caddis

**Comments:** Dennis didn't provide pattern details, but it's safe to assume it involves CDC & possibly the Magic Tool.

## **PATTERN DEMONSTRATION**

Tier: Rick Lang

Hook: Henry's Lake Renegade

Hook: Mustad 9671, #8 to #16

Thread: Red 6/0 or 8/0 pre-waxed

Tag: Red thread

Tail: Brown Neck Hackle, 2 wraps, dry fly style

Rib Red thread, doubled, 4 or 5 wraps
Body: Peacock herl, 2 or 3, extra thin body
Hackle: Brown neck hackle, 2 wraps, dry fly style

Head: Red thread

**Comments:** Rick will demo a general attractor pattern that he says is "Marv's Fly of the Week"
