OCTOBER 12TH

PATTERN DEMONSTRATION

Tier: Michael Dell
Pattern: Catatonic Leech

Hook: #10 to #12 - 2xl Nymph

Thread: Black or olive

Weight: Lead wire or lead substitute

Tail Olive Marabou

Body: Olive Marabou, dubbed

Comments: Michael will demo a pattern that he demonstrated last June. While for some it might be repetition, it is a good beginner fly and has been producing very well recently at Muir and Star lakes

OCTOBER 19TH

PATTERN DEMONSTRATION

Tier: Dave Robinson

Pattern: Elk Hair Caddis (tan)

Hook: #10 to #18 long shank dry fly

Thread: Tan 8/0

Rib: Tan Saddle Hackle - clipped

Body: Tan antron dubbing

Antennae: Stripped quills – colored tan (optional)

Thorax: Brown antron dubbing

Wing: Tan Elk Hair (deer hair alternate)

Comments: Dave has been pressed into service due to a mix up on dates. He will tye a durable standard pattern that will prove useful for many occasions. The pattern can be considered an intermediate pattern, as it requires a special technique to ensure the elk hair wing is mounted properly

Topic: Basic Stream Entomology
