MEETINGS

FEBRUARY 1 ST

PATTERN DEMONSTRATION

Tiers: Greg Scratchley
Pattern: Water Docman
Hook: Dry #10- #14
Thread: Black 6/0
Body: Tan nymph skin

Legs: Superfloss in black/tan/duck

Wingcase/Back: Brown foam Head: Whip finished

Comments: Since he always fishes chironomids, Scratch figures Doc (Mike Monteith, the originator) will never demonstrate this one, so he will do it instead.

Pattern: Diving Holo Caddis
Hook: Tiemco 200R (12 to 16)

Bead: Olive Tread: Olive 8/0

Overbody: Mixed olive /dun S'lon Abdomen: Mirage crystal flash Thorax: Olive seal dubbing

Legs: Partridge

Comments: This is a pattern directly based on Gary Lafontaine's Sparkle caddis series. The fly is tied to represent a caddis emerging / failing to emerge from the water by creating the appearance of a gas bubble around the caddis body/case during hatch.

Pattern: Red Butt Weevil

Hooks: #10 to #16 Tiemco 200 R or 2487

Bead: Gold Tungsten

Butt: Bright red rabbit dubbing
Tail: Brown or rust biots
Rib: Fine copper wire
Shellback: Mirage pearl flash

Abdomen: Light Peacock UV dubbing
Thorax: Dark Peacock dubbing
Legs: Brown or rust biots

Comments: This is Scratch's variation of the famous Eevil Weevil by Jeremy Davies except for the red butt and slight color change. He uses the heavy bead or tungsten because this is his go-to fly for whitefish, goldeye, mooneye - and grayling - all of which tend to hang low in the water column - in typically fast moving water.

FEBRUARY 8TH

PATTERN DEMONSTRATION

Tier: Bill Lee

Pattern: Clouser Minnow

Hooks: #3/0 to #6 O'Shaughnessey or 9671 Mustad

Eyes: Lead barbell, red with black pupil Throat: White fish hair or white thread

Body: White bucktail, chartreuse fish hair, pearl

crystal flash

Options: Silver mylar flash wrap in shank

Comment: This is a fresh and salt water fly. The style, with the barbell eyes, provides good movement with the hook pointing upwards. Chartreuse and white is a favorite color. Pattern: Muddler Minnow

Hooks: #6 to #12 - 9671 Mustad

Tail: Slip of mottled turkey feather

Body: Flat gold mylar tinsel, rib with oval tinsel Wing: Grey squirrel hair and mottled turkey feather

Collar/head: Deer hair

Comment: Muddlers are now tied as a general attractor pattern and to imitate anything from caddis flies to grasshopper, While all muddlers will differ in color and profile, all ha e the same basic construction

FEBRUARY 15TH

Tier: Darren McEachern

Pattern: Bleeding Schlappen Leech

Thread: Black 8/0

Hooks: #4 to #10 – 3XL Streamer hook Beads: 5 to 7 silver lined red beads

Tail: Black Marabou Hackle: Black Schlappen

Pattern: Caca Doic (Goose Turd)

Thread: 8/0 dark brown

Hooks: #10 to #16 -94841 Mustad dry fly

Body: Mylar tinsel
Thorax: Olive/Yellow CDC
Hackle: Hen back or partridge

Comment: Darren's first fly incorporates a material we seldom use and the second will make use of the magic tool.

FEBRUARY 22ND

IRON FLY TYER

Iron Fly Tyer: Dale Johnson

Challengers: Mike Monteith (aka: Doc)

Alex Del-Hiero (aka: Ballast)

Patterns: Dry fly, Wet fly and Nymph Hook: Dry #12, Wet #8, Nymph #10

Material: Surprise!

Format: The competitors will use their own materials and equipment to construct at least three flys in a one-hour time frame. A special "surprise" material will be given out at the start of tying that the participants will have to incorporate it into each fly. The flys will be judged on: Appearance, Tying Techniques, Originality, Best Use of Mystery Material and Potential Catching Ability The winner earns the coveted title of "Iron Fly Tyer" until the next competition.

Comments: The smash success of the last two years returns with Dale Johnson defending his title against two challengers: Each will test their tying skill against the Master in a trio of patterns. Come prepared to be amazed (and to heckle).
