Topic: Married Wing Wet Fly Techniques

Comment: Alberta Al will show us how to do wet fly wings that join two or more feathers together. These are typically used for full dress salmon flies, but can be used on others.

PATTERN DEMONSTRATION

Presenter: Dennis Southwick
Pattern: Techno Nymph
Thread: Olive 8/0

Hooks: #10 3 XL Streamer
Bed head: Glow in the dark bead
Tails: Yellow and Chartreuse Llama
Body: Yellow seed beads 3 or 4
Hackle: Yellow and olive CDC
Dubbing: Yellow diamond dub

Legs: Yellow, black and white striped rubber

Thorax: Dark olive llama and dark emu Wing case: Pearlescent Easter basket fuzz

Comment: Dennis will show an unusual pattern using the magic tool. If he as time he may do another pattern

APRIL 19TH

PATTERN DEMONSTRATION

Presenter: Rod Boisvert

Pattern: #1 Wet Gold Ribbed Hares Ear c/w wingcase

Hook: # 16 to #10 Mustad 3906B or R50

Thread: Uni brown 8/0
Tail: Natural hare's mask
Rib: Gold mylar

Rib: Gold Hiylar

Body: Natural hare's mask

Wing case: Goose primary coated with Flexament Thorax: Natural hare's mask with guard hairs

Option: Gold bead head **Pattern:** #2 GRHE - Dry

Same as #1 but without the wing case or bead Hook: Mustad R030 or TMC 100

Pattern: #3 GRHE – Green / Wet

Same as #1 except for:

Tail: Green Pheasant tail
Rib: Gold or yellow Uni-wire
Body: Green hare's mask
Wing case: Green Pheasant tail

Pattern: #4 GRHE - Grey / Wet

Same as #1 except for: Thread: Uni Red 8/0

Tag: Red holographic mylar
Tail: Grey hen hackle
Rib: Silver wire

Body: Grey rabbit dubbing

Wing case: Grey hen

Comment: Rod will show us few different variations of this old standby pattern.

APRIL 26TH

Presenter: Dave Murray (Wooly)

Pattern: Variations on the Wooly Bugger
Pattern 1: Crystal Chenille Wooly
Pattern 2: Egg Sucking Wooly
Pattern 3: Green Crystal Wooly
Pattern 4: Bead Head Wooly

Comment: This set of patterns is appropriate given Dave's web alias. The Crystal Wooly was inspired by Barry White.
