#### FROM THE EDITOR

#### What a Month!

We also managed to hold our Annual General Meeting. We not only elected a new executive for 2007 (see the list to the right), but we also enacted our first Club Charter. #### FEBRUARY 7TH

Pattern: Eevil Weevil
Tyer: Rick Lang
Hook Wet fly # 10 - # 18
Thread: 8/0 or 6/0 black

Bead: Brass or Tungsten to suit Flashback: Pearlescent mylar strips Rib: Fine copper wire

Abdomen: Peacock Arizona dubbing
Thorax: Dark peacock Arizona dubbing

Wing White or tan goose biots

**Comment:** The Eevil Weevil is a go-to fly on certain streams where grayling and rockies lurk. Its effectiveness fished under an indicator can't be understated. Rick will clue you in.

#### **BEGINNERS FLY TYING**

Pattern: Bead Head Pheasant Tail Nymph

Hook Wet fly - 2xl - # 12 to # 16

Thread 6/0 to 8/0 black

Bead: Brass or Tungsten to suit
Tail & Body: Pheasant tail fibres
Rib: Medium to fine copper wire

Body: Pheasant Tail Abdomen: Peacock herl

Wing Case & Legs: Pheasant tail fibres

**Comment:** The fifth session of the year will cover a very basic but productive nymph with a "secret" variation. If you have a vise and tools, bring them along. If not we can provide club loaners for the evening.

Hook Wet fly - 2xl - # 12 to # 16

Thread 6/0 to 8/0 black

Bead: Brass or Tungsten to suit

Flashback: Mylar strip

Rib: Medium to fine copper wire Tail & Body: Pheasant tail fibres

Body: Pheasant Tail Abdomen: Peacock herl

Wing Case & Legs: Pheasant tail fibres

**Comment:** Wooley's baaaack! He'll demonstrate this productive variation of the beginner fly tied previously this month. Expect a few stories to accompany the demo.

Pattern: Elk Hair Caddis
Hook Dry fly - # 12 to # 16

Thread 6/0 to 8/0 tan

Rib: Medium to fine copper wire

Hackle Grizzly – clipped Body: Tan Dubbing Wing: Deer Hair

**Comment:** The sixth session of the year features Al Troth's famous & versatile pattern & will cure your deer hair phobia.


#### FEBRUARY 28<sup>th</sup>
