FROM THE EDITOR

Fishing Season Finally Here!!

The Beginner Casting Clinic on May 3rd had about 20 students with four instructors. It went very well with all students learning the basic casting stroke. Thanks very much to John, Rick and Ron for helping out. As I write this the Intermediate Clinic is coming up on May 31st at Rundle Park. I expect roughly the same cast of characters to be there for a review and refresher and to learn how to turn the basic stroke into "fishing casts".

The program this month opens on June 4th has Prez Dave Murray demonstrating Quill Bodies. Week two on June 4th brings our 4th annual Pre Season Material Swap. There should be lots of odds and ends of materials and other fishing stuff available for bargain basement prices. Week three on June 18th we host Cameron Stevens of Goulder Associates talking about assessment work on the Raven River. Tyer: Dave Murray (aka Wooley)

Pattern: Quill Bodies

Hook: Dry Fly #12 to 18 Thread 6/0 color to suit

Body: Stripped hackle quills or peacock herl

Wing: Anton, color to suit
Hackle: Saddle hackle, color to suit

Comment: President Dave will show us how to make fly bodies made of feather quill. This technique makes for a small, light body with natural segmentation.

JUNE 11TH

PRE SEASON MATERIAL SWAP

Comments: Bring out your surplus tying material, fishing gadgets and gear. Proceeds of club material sales go to the club. This is a chance to get rid of or acquire some more "junk" and help build club coffers. (Remember one man's junk is another's treasure.)

AUGUST 13TH TO 17TH


Tom Fry Memorial Alberta Klave and Fly Swap
