FROM THE EDITOR

Fall fishing almost over with Christmas just around the corner.

I managed another late season fishing trip with friend and club member Gregory Humpries two weeks ago on the Red Deer River. Once again it was fine day to be out in the fresh air. The wind made it a bit challenging, but the fishing was pretty good with Greg catching his first fish on an indicator nymphing rig. The geese seemed to cheer every catch. The fish varied in size from 6 to over 19 inches, which bodes well for the future of that fishery.

Our October program is almost finished as I write this. Our first meeting featured Don Anderson talking about the history and construction of cane rods. The second week Michael Dell continued his beginner sessions with a dry fly. The third week we had Mike Sullivan of SRD give us a sobering talk about the future of the Saskatchewan River drainage. The last week will feature Michael Dell showing us his way of tying a Parachute Adams.

On Saturday November 21st, LeRoy Hyatt of PBS's Fly Tying the Angler's Art gave us what I believe was the highlight of the year. The one day intermediate fly tying seminar was enjoyed by all 40 people attending. Leroy proved to be the true gentleman we expected and made the day fun and informative. From the sounds of things, he enjoyed himself as well. We even had guests from Red Deer and Canmore, some of whom spent as much time laughing and giggling as tying. Prez Dave won another rod (I'm beginning to suspect his luck) and other attendees went away with some pretty nice raffle items. All in all a great event for which thanks go out primarily to Brian Bleakley and his usual cast of characters, including Rick Lang, Dennis Southwick, Emmerson Dober, Dave Murray, and others who pitched in and hopefully will not be offended by my not remembering them. (They say memory is the second thing to go.) Congratulations to all who made it a memorable event.

The Raven River Redd Count is complete for this year. The late start and cold weather curtailed the number of sections covered. Next year, Northern Lights will take the lead in organizing and manning the count. This is an ongoing TU initiative that needs our support.

Our program this month starts on December 2nd when we have Michael Dell continuing the beginner sessions by showing us how to tie a Bead Head Brooks Montana Stone. Week two, on December 9th will be our Conservation Session. We're trying for a high-ranking official from Sustainable Resources Development, but have yet to finalize. Week three on December 16th will be our Christmas Wind-up, with pizza and pop provided. It will be a short month.

We have a winter fly swap underway, hosted by Dennis Southwick. For those who don't know the drill, a fly swap is where a group of tyers (usually 12 to 24) tie and trade flies. The Swapmaster selects the theme of the swap, each participant selects a pattern within that theme and ties one fly of that pattern for each participant. The tied flies are submitted to the Swapmaster who then distributes them to the participants. Each fly must have a name and toe tag. The theme for this swap is Burlap Flies. There's still room to participate. If you are interested, drop a note to Dennis via the forum.

On page two you will find a list of upcoming events for 2010. The main items of note are our January Seminar featuring Garry Borger and Mike Lawson on January 16th and 17th and the Annual General Meeting on January 20th, where we will elect next year's executive and approve the revised club logo. After that we have three shows to organize and plan for. Help will be needed in various capacities, so expect to be asked to contribute to at least one.





PROPOSED CHARTER CHANGE


