Wing: Red Saddle Hackle over Yellow Saddle hackle

Cheeks: Jungle Cock, Rather Short

Pattern Grey Ghost

Tag: Narrow Flat Silver TinselBody: Red or Orange FlossRib: Fine Silver WireWing: 4 Grey Saddle Hackle

Over Wing: 4 Strands of peacock Hearl Throat: Golden Pheasant Crest Fibers Cheeks: Silver Pheasant Body Feathers

and Jungle Cock Eyes

Pattern: Cosseboom Streamer

Tag: Flat Silver TinselTail: Golden Pheasant CrestRib: Flat Silver TinselBody: Orange Silk Floss

Throat: Extremely Small bunches of 4 items: Bronze

Peacock herl, Grey Squirrel Tail, Green Peacock herl, Red Squirrel Tail, AND DO IT AGAIN Wing: Black and White Teal Feathers as a collar Cheeks: Teal Body Feather, Jungle Cock Eyes

Head: Red Thread
