From March 31<sup>st</sup> to April 3<sup>rd</sup> we'll be doing similar stuff at the Fishing Hole and Campers Village Outdoor Show. February 16<sup>th</sup> we have a conservation session with a Speaker to be Announced. On February 23<sup>rd</sup> our own Peter Little will show us how to tye Hot Spots and a Balanced Leech. 

Pattern: Ida May (lake)

Hook Mustad, 2 or 3XL - #6 to #14

Bead Black Lead or Glass Tail Dark olive Marabou Body Dark Olive Chenille

Rib Gold Wire

Collar Dark olive grizzly hackle (1 ½ to 2 turns)

Pattern: *Ida May (Stream)*Hook Mustad, 2 or 3x1 - #8 to #16

Bead Black (lead)
Tail Moose Hair
Body Peacock Hurl
Rib Gold wire

Collar One turn Grizzle dyed yellow and one dyed olive

Pattern: Evil Damsel

Hook Tiemco 2457 - #8 to #10 Bead Copper or Gold to fit Tail Golden Olive Marabou Body Golden Olive Marabou

Thorax Peacock hurl or Arizona synthetic natural peacock

Wing case Pearl Flashabou
Wings White Goose Biots
