## From the Editor

#### Winter Sessions Over! Time To Go Fishing!

Spring is here! It's time to head out for some early season fishing. There's still some time to do preparations though. We've a few club meetings and a couple of events left to go.

Our first Introduction to Fly Fishing Seminar this year goes on May 28<sup>th</sup> at Queen Mary Park and May 29<sup>th</sup> at Cardiff Pond. We'll have about a dozen students come out for two full days of instruction on fly fishing equipment, materials, technique and patterns. The second day will feature casting instruction and actual fishing on the pond. Rick Lang will lead the effort with help from other club members. We will need some volunteers for the casting and fishing portion, so if you can help out, let Rick know this week.

Our second "Introduction to Fly Fishing Seminar" for this year will be held Jume4<sup>th</sup> for the classroom session and June 5<sup>th</sup> for the field session. The second session will have more students than for the first one. We may need additional volunteers to assist with the casting and fishing portion, so if you can pitch in, Rick Lang and I will much appreciate it.

Our regular program for May once again consisted of four sessions. It started May 4th with Rod Boisvert tying a Trio of Rod's Flies. On May 11<sup>th</sup> we held our regular Free Tye and Beginner Advice session. May 18<sup>th</sup> Dan Tulik presented Tying with Dipper Dan. The month winds up on May 25<sup>th</sup> with yours truly Dave Robinson demonstrating Parachutes using a couple of different materials. I'm sure all who came out enjoyed the fun and conversation. Thanks go to the presenters and attendees. We even activated the "Sherman Wayback Machine" and had some long time members show up whom we haven't seen for a while. It was nice to see the familiar faces.

We will only have three meetings in June. We start on June 1<sup>st</sup> with Dave Murray with Woolleys Flies. On June 8<sup>th</sup> well have our usual Free Tye but since Junior is away on his honeymoon, we'll have a Casting Clinic on the grass outside the building instead of beginner tying. Bring along your rod and get some kinks out. We'll have some "experts" around to "critique" casting strokes and help with any casting problems. And no, this is a help session not heckling. On June 15<sup>th</sup> we wind up the spring with a Club Barbecue out at Muir Lake.

We're not having an official summer program this year. Attendance last year was pretty spotty. That doesn't mean the Club will be inactive, just that events will be impromptu and will likely be organized via the Club Forum. Keep your eyes on the Forum for that and also for chitchat on fishing conditions.

Here is advance notice of events planned for the fall and winter. We'll resume our regular meetings on September 14<sup>th</sup> at Queen Mary Park with a "BS and Brag Session". We've also set the date and location for our Fall Fundraiser and Silent Auction. This year we will be at the St Albert Curling Club on November 5<sup>th</sup>. We're finalizing menus and costs and will advise those via the Club Web Page. In the mean time, start chasing donations for the silent auction. This coming year we'll feature the Dynamite Duo of Jack Dennis and Phil Rowley on January 21<sup>st</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup>. Both have presented here before, but both always have something new and interesting to share. We can guarantee two fabulous fishing related days in the depth of winter. # June 1st Woolley's Flies

Presenter: Dave Murray
Pattern: Quill Body

Hook: #14 Dry fly (1x light if possible)
Thread: Olive 70 dernier,8/0 thread

Body: Olive died quill

Wing post: olive or brown poly pro...wing post Hackle: olive, tan or died grizzly hackle

Pattern: Hares Ear Dry

Hook: Size 4 to 12 2x long, 2x fine (Mustad 94831)

Thread: Grey 70 dernier (8/0)
Tail: Dark Dun Hackle fibres

Body: Dark grey Antron, hares ear mix

Light grey Antron, hares ear mix

Wing Post: Mixed cream and light grey Antron fibres

Hackle: light dun tied as a parachute

Pattern: Bullet Head Hopper

Hook: Size 4 to 12 2x long, 2x fine (Mustad 94831)

Thread: Yellow 140 dernier, 6/0 thread brown saddle hackle clipped short

Body: yellow Antron dubbing

Tail: small loop of closed cell yellow foam Wing: Under wing; Olive Deer or elk hair

Over wing; mottled hen hackle,

(Indian hackle feather)

Head: Dark Deer or elk hair (bullet head)

Comment: Woolley will demonstrate three interesting patterns. The bullet head only if time permits

Comment: Bring your vices and tools and tye along with us. Tie your own patterns or tye along with an experienced tyer. We'll also have an impromptu casting clinic on the grass outside the hall.
