### From the Editor

#### Summer's Over! Fabulous Fall Fishing On the Way!

For me the summer was pretty slow fishing-wise. The late spring with all the wet weather cut into stream fishing until well into July. I did get out a couple of times with modest success. I hope to do better starting in September. The summer heat may be departing, but lower water levels and fine fall weather will ensure a good fall fishing season. It's time to cram in those final trips before the snow flies (yech).

Just to recap things since the last newsletter: We held our Introduction to Fly Fishing Seminar May 28<sup>th</sup> and May 29<sup>th</sup> followed by the second sessions June 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup>. We had almost two dozen students come out for two full days of instruction on fly fishing equipment, materials, technique and patterns with actual fishing on Cardiff pond. Rick Lang led the effort with help from other club members. All participants seemed to enjoy themselves and most caught fish. Thanks from Rick and me go out to all those NLFT stalwarts who came out to help. We hope to reconnect with the students in the fall with an on-stream session (to be determined).

Our June program consisted of four sessions. It began with Dave Murray tying Woolley's Flies, with a free tye and a casting clinic the following week. The last meeting for the spring session featured our wind up barbeque at the club with burgers, dogs and pop for all comers.

We did not have an official summer program this year. I lieu, the club put effort into the Grayling Survey Forum in the Pembina River drainage. From the sounds of things, despite less than cooperative weather and stream flows, there was some success and some puzzling failures. Success was from fish being caught in places that were not anticipated and the failures were some fine looking water that didn't seem to have fish. Once all the results have been tabulated, we'll ask for a report from Jim O'Neill. It looks though, as if it is going to be worthwhile enough for us to continue the effort next year.

Your executive met in mid August to start planning for the fall and winter. In addition to discussing the Grayling Survey, we've been working on timing and budget for the Fall Fundraiser and January Seminar and planning the September program. We will only have three meetings in September. We'll resume our regular meetings on September 14<sup>th</sup> at Queen Mary Park with a "BS and Brag Session". We continue on September 21<sup>st</sup> with Dennis Southwick showing us his easy to tie Hopper and Humpy. On September 28<sup>th</sup> we'll have newcomer Taun Nguyen giving us a demonstration of Three New Flies

We've set the date and location for our Fall Fundraiser and Silent Auction. This year we will be at the St Albert Curling Club on November 5<sup>th</sup>. The menu features a AAA prime rib dinner. # September 21st Easy Flies

Presenter: Dennis Southwick
Pattern: Easy Hopper

Hook #12 light wired scud hook (Daiichi 1130) Thread 6/0 Fire orange or florescent orange

Tail Red elk or deer hair
Body Foam - yellow or tan
Wing Natural elk or deer hair

Legs Rubber hackle - your choice of colour Post optional - white or orange poly

Glue Zap A Gap (important)

Pattern: Easy Humpy

Hook size 12 Dry fly hook (Daiichi 1110) Thread 6/0 or 8/0 color your choice

Tail Natural elk or deer hair

Body Thread or Dubbing Color your choice

Wing White poly or Antron
Hackle Grizzly or brown grizzly
Skill Patience is important

**Comment:** Dennis will demonstrate a hopper variation that did significant damage on the Freeman this summer. He'll also demonstrate and easy to tie Humpy. His comment: "These flys catch fish!"

### September 28th Three New Flies

Presenter: Tuan Nguyen

Pattern: Mylar Floating Minnow
Hook: 5XL streamer @2 to 10
favorite black tying tread

Tail: Black Marabou

Under Body: Closed Cell Craft Foam, 10 mm Outer Body: Large Mylar Tubing: Olive

Eyes: Sequin, black beads and 20 lbs mono

Body Color: Black Sharpie

**Comment:** A large sewing needle will be required (large enough for 20 lbs mono) Substitute Sequin eyes with craft doll eyes, medium

Pattern: Horizontal Mohair Dropper Leech

Hook: 1/32 oz gumball jig, black Thread: favorite black tying tread

Tail: & Body: Mohair Yarn in your favorite Leech color.

I will be using Black and Peacock

Rib: Fine Red Wire
Dropper loop: 20 lbs mono
Comment: Optional Marabou tail

### September 28th Continued

**Pattern:** Two Tone Chironomid

Hook: # 12 Scud hook

Tail: Red thread, I use UTC 140 Body: Green thread, I use UTC 140

Bead : Med Black Bead Rib: Silver Mylar Tinsel,

Thorax: Peacock herl

Gills: White/Cream Antron Yarn

**Comment:** Use any thread you like for the body color, black

and green are my favorites.
