FROM THE EDITOR

March brings hints of spring, but cabin fever still rules!

March came in kind of mild, which if you believe the old wives' tale, means we'll see poorer weather at the end of the month. But what do old wives know? I'm busy tying a few flies to fill the holes in my boxes from last year in hopes of an early spring. I'm also adding a few "must have" patterns for my upcoming trip to Cuba. If spring doesn't come early here, then at least I can go where it is already summer. Six NLFT guys are headed south in May for a shot at some Bonefish, Permit and Tarpon. I got a taste of what is to come two weeks ago in Hawaii. I didn't get a chance fish on our vacation to the Big Island, but did swim with some dolphins. That was a pleasant break from Edmonton's winter. I even missed the big snow. For those who stuck around, our regular February program consisted of five sessions. On February 1st we had Dennis Southwick demonstrating an SA Hopper. February 8th Phil Rowley demoed patterns for Stillwaters. The third February week on the 15th Bill Patterson talked about his research into stocking efforts and angler satisfaction. The week of February 22nd was a Free Tye. The final (and unusually extra, fifth) week of February we got Rod Boisvert demonstrating a Peacock Leech and Fullback Nymph (an extra pattern in honor of Leap Day). Thanks go to all our presenters for entertaining and thought provoking programs! March sees us get back to the usual number of meetings. March 7th starts with a business meeting followed by Ken Monk and Kristi Kinoshita giving us a working Tour of the Club Web Page and Forum. For the mid March meeting on March 14th we have Dennis Southwick presenting Let's Get Stoned. The third meeting, on March 21st will be a Free Tye. Once again Dennis will pilot a new beginner idea that day as well. Lastly for the month, On March 28^{tl} we will have Elton Hunter as a guest speaker talking about being Bear Aware.

We continue preparations or our two major outreach efforts in March. The Edmonton Boat and Sportsman's Show is March 15th through 18th at the Expo Center at Edmonton Northlands. Over the four days the Kids Tying Tables will need volunteer instructors and the booth will need helpers to promote Club Membership and our sport, plus help sell tickets to our Beginner Fly Tying and Introduction to Fly Fishing Seminars. If you work a 4-hour shift we'll pay your parking and if you work two shifts over a meal time we'll pay for your food. Of course for volunteers show admission is free.

The second event for March is the Outdoor Show at the Mayfield Convention Center the weekend of March 22^{nd} to 25^{th} . This annual event is put on by the Fishin' Hole. Not only will we be manning the Kids Tying, promoting the club and its events, we'll also be manning the Bucket Raffle for the Lloyd Shea Fisheries Enhancement Fund. After March, the next major events are the Beginner's Fly Tying Seminar planned for April 21st (Note that the date for the Fly tying Seminar has changed since last newsletter due to room availability) and the Introduction to Fly-fishing Seminar set for May 26th & 27th. We'll be looking for volunteers for these as well. We'll have posters and tickets for sale at the two and further information on the web page.

We have one other volunteer request. Our Librarian, Florin Sabac would like some help in cataloging our library. This would entail entering book information into a computer database so that we can better manage our inventory. If you think you can help out, let Florin know.

Spring may be a ways off, but it's not too early to prepare!

MARCH 14TH

LET'S GET STONED

Presenter: Dennis Southwick
Pattern 1: Brook's Montana Stone
Hook: 3x long wet fly, #2 to #10

Thread: #8/0, black

Weight: Gold bead or 0.025 lead wire or substitute

Tail: Goose biots, black Rib: Wire, gold or copper

Body: Yarn or dubbing, black and fuzzy

Hackle ostrich herl and 1 grizzly and 1 brown saddle

Pattern 2: Neo 20 incher

Hook: Daichi 1270, 3x long nymph, #2 to #10

Thread: # 8/0, tan or olive Bead Black or Gold

Weight: 0.025 lead wire or substitute, front half

Tail: Goose biots, brown or black

Rib: Wire, gold

Abdomen: Peacock Herl or Peacock Arizona dubbing

Thorax: Arizona semi-seal golden peacock

Wing Case: Thin Skin - mottled oak

Pattern 3: Stimulator

Hook: 3x long dry fly, #8 Thread: 36/0 or # 8/0, orange or red

Tail: Elk Hair Rib: Brown Hackle

Abdomen: Dubbing or Antron yarn, orange

Wing: Elk Hair
Thorax Dubbing, yellow
Hackle: Grizzly saddle

Comment: Dennis will talk about stoneflies and demonstrate a pattern for each of the insect's stages of interest to the fly fisher. This is an important trout food and anglers should have a sampling of these patterns for most Alberta streams

Comment: Bring your vices out and spend some time chatting and tying with your fishing friends. Dennis Southwick will again try a pilot run of his new idea for a beginner program that he intends to run concurrent with the Free Tye evenings.
