Thread: 8/0 olive thread
Tail: Pheasant tail fibres
Cold Wire

Rib: Gold Wire Back: Mylar flash

Abdomen: Light Arizona peacock dubbing

Wings: Brown goose biots

Thorax: Natural Arizona peacock dubbing Comment: Michael will demonstrate Jeremy Davies invention. This is also a Beginner's Night where, for those interested, Dennis will help with a basic fly. You are encouraged to bring your vices and either tye along with us or work on filling your boxes.

## **PARACHUTE PATTERNS**

Pattern: RS Quad

Hook: Partridge Klinkhammer #20

Thread: Gray 8/0

Wing: White turkey flats
Tail: Gray Zeelon
Body: Gray goose biots
Thorax: Peacock herl
Hackle: Grizzly saddle

**Comment:** Dave and Rick will demonstrate two different versions of how to tie a parachute pattern. The RS quad was invented by former club member Roman Scharabun and is so named for what Roman saw as its four strike triggers
