Tyer: Dave Phelps

Pattern: Flashback Hare's Ear

Hook: # 12 to #14 3X Nymph **Head:** Gold Tungsten Bead

Tail: Woodcock fibres, color to match dubbing Body: Hare's ear and antron dubbing, color to suit

Wing Case: Pearlescent flashabou

Comments: Dave wants us to come prepared to tie two or three flies each for the TU box as well. Patterns to be: BH Hare's Ear, Prince Nymph, Wolley Bugger, Pheasant Tail Nymph, Green Doc Spratley and Backswimmer.

JANUARY 12

Tyer: Dennis Southwick Pattern: Damsel Nymph

Hook: #16 or #18 Pupa (shrimp hook)

Eyes: Plastic bead chain eyes (must be plastic)

Tail: Green or olive marabou

Body: Green or olive Ultra Chenille (must be Ultra)

Thorax: Green or olive dubbing

Wing Case: Pearlescent diamond braid flashabou

Pattern: Extended Body Caddis

Hook: #14 - #18 Pupa
Thread: Kevlar or 3 lb tippet

Body: 5 beads of your favorite color

(green, amber and black)

Dubbing: To match beads

Legs: Speckled soft hackle fibres optional

Comments: Time permitting Dennis will demo a cased caddis using soft grouse or partridge hackle, light green or yellow body dubbing with a dark head and grouse hackle legs.

Tyer: Gord Boutette
Pattern: Spawn Spey Fly

Hook: # 2/0 #36890 Limerick #079

Thread: #6/0 Chinese Red
Tail: Flat oval tinsel - small
Body: Burnt orange floss

Hackle: Burgundy spey hackle - palmered

Rib: Flat oval tinsel

Head: Flashabou #6905 extra limp, yellow schlappen, red schlappen, whip finish and 2 coats of head cement
