Olive Pheasant rump

Collar:

Filo plume feather

Head:

(secondary feather underneath pheasant rump)

Tying thread

Pattern:

Hook:

3x nymph, 6 through 12.

I like a # 6. (weighted) Golden Yellow

Thread: Tail:

Goose Biots - gold/light brown

Body:

Gold Wool overwrapped withgold floss

Hackle:

Brown Saddle or any soft brown hackle

Thorax:

Peacock Herl

Wing Case: Dark goose primary or turkey primary

Head:

Tying thread
