We start *March* 5<sup>th</sup> with a short business meeting followed by a *Beginner Session*. The second week on *March* 12<sup>th</sup> will feature a *Ruben Breitkreuz* with a presentation on *New Fly Fishing Products*. We continue on week three on *March* 19<sup>th</sup> we will have a *Free Tye and Beginner Session*. We'll do rerun of the *Open Discussion* we tried out last month based on a topics raised at the meeting. Week four on *March* 26<sup>th</sup> has *Ken Monk and Jim O'Neil* providing an update on the *Grayling Survey Results*. Our *Fly of the Month* for March is the *March Brown*. You can use Free Tye nights to add to the box of flies intended for the annual TU Dinner in March.

February meetings consisted of 4 sessions. The first meeting was the usual business meeting followed by a free tye and a round table discussion on topic of interest raised at the meeting. That seemed to go well so we'll try again this month. At the second week meeting we were officially presented with our National Recreational Fisheries Award by Canada Fisheries and Oceans. That was followed by a presentation by Mark Del Deagon on Tenkara fishing and Horsehair Fly Lines. Week three was a Free Tye beginner session. The last meeting featured Dennis Southwick "dennisizing" soft hackle and klinkhammer hook-based flies.

Our executive is still short Secretary and Library positions. Do we have any volunteers? Dave Murray, Jim Trewin and Steve DiGiuseppe have stepped up to fill the programs (normal and special events) role. Membership has been taken up by Roger Comeau.

The beginners program continues based on Charlie Craven's book "Basic Fly Tying". We'll loan the book to those who register and they can use it in an "advance at you own pace" process. Club members will provide instruction and materials at meetings.

The *Edmonton Boat and Sportsman's Show* runs *March 13<sup>th</sup> to 17<sup>th</sup>, 2014* at *Edmonton Northlands*. We'll need volunteers for the kids tying booth and as well as at the Fishin' Hole booth. Volunteers get free admission to the show while they are volunteering, we pick up your parking costs and, if you put in enough time, meal costs. You can add your name to the volunteer list time slots at any meeting prior to the event or by contacting Steve DeGiuseppe. We'll be participating in a Cabalas event on March 22<sup>nd</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup>. We will provide people to represent the Club We may need three or four people to cover the weekend. If you want to join in with either event, let Dennis know.

You'll see from the next page that we have a bunch of clinics and seminars coming up in April and May. We start with Beginners Fly Tying on April 5<sup>th</sup> with Learn to Fly Fish (LTFF) seminars on April 26<sup>th</sup> and May 10<sup>th</sup>. We follow that up with Beginner and Intermediate Casting Clinics on May 24<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup>. All are held at Queen Mary Park except the April 26<sup>th</sup> Learn to Fly Fish will be at the Lions Center and Casting Clinics at Rundle Park. Learn to Fly Fish Seminars cost \$50.00 and include lunch. The others are \$25.00 and participants are on their own for lunch. We'll be selling tickets at the Sportsman's' Show and Club meetings. And the Annual TU Dinner and Auction goes on May 8<sup>th</sup> at the Crown Plaza/Chateau Lacombe. You can expect volunteer lists to begin appearing soon. We'll need volunteers for the clinics and seminars and the TU dinner. If you can help out, let any exec member know.

Let's hope Spring is just around the corner!

Dry Fly #12 to #18 Hook:

8/0 tan Thread:

Brown hackle fibers Tail: Rib: Brown floss Body: Tan dubbing Wood duck Wing: Hackle: Brown and grizzly



Comment: This month's fly is appropriately named. The pattern above is for a traditional dry, but you could do a wet fly or parachute. The object is to provide flies to stock a box for the annual Trout Unlimited Dinner. Each member is encouraged to tye one or more of each month's pattern.
