#### From the Editor

#### May is "Rivers Run Thorough It" month!!

This time the month-long theme is all about rivers. Look for each program to contain some connection with fishing in flowing water. The month long theme idea seems to be gaining traction so we'll be looking for more theme month suggestions for the fall.

Unfortunately due to receiving program info late, the May newsletter is a bit behind schedule. Some events have already taken place. The Annual TU Dinner and Auction was on May 8<sup>th</sup> at the Crown Plaza/Chateau Lacombe. We had enough volunteers to help out and by all reports the event was a rousing success. We started our regular monthly program on May 7th with a short business meeting followed by a Free Tye, Beginner Session and Discussion. And last weekend we ran the second Learn to Fly Fish Seminar. Although attendance was small, it made for a good teacher to pupil ratio. And those who did come learned a lot.

The second week regular program event is on May 14<sup>th</sup> and will feature Tying Booths with a theme of Summertime Dry Flies. We continue on week three on May 21<sup>st</sup> with a Free Tye, Beginner Session and Discussion on Flowing Water Tactics. Week four on May 28<sup>th</sup> has Dennis Southwick and Steve DiGiuseppe tying Big Flash Flies.

On *May 24th Doc (aka Mike)* is running a *Muir Lake Cleanup and BBQ* out at the lake. If you want to pitch in, come prepared to help with some refreshments or snacks and your fishing gear. It stands to be a great get together.

Also on May 24<sup>th</sup> we will run our Beginner Casting at Rundle Park at a \$25.00 cost. Participants are on their own for lunch. The suggestion has been made to adjourn the clinic sometime after lunch and go out to Muir to practice on water and join the party there. Since we had to cancel the Intermediate Casting Clinic due to low enrolment, we'll try to cover the intermediate casting stuff by introducing casting sessions at Queen Mary Park during regular meetings, weather permitting.

June will be a short month for NLFT. The first week on *June 4<sup>th</sup>* will again be a *Free Tye*, *Beginner Session and Discussion* (topic to be announced). The second week on June 11<sup>th</sup> will be our Spring Windup and Barbeque. There may not be a June newsletter.

April meetings consisted of 5 sessions. The first meeting was the usual business meeting followed by a free tye and a round table on still water patterns. The second week featured Phil Rowley and his terrific presentation on fishing still waters. Week three was a Free Tye and Beginner session featuring the Sno Cone. On week four we had Craig Copeland come and talk about hatchery operations and stocking. The last April session featured Charlie Eddy tying some east coast style streamers. And lastly, the Kids Can Catch event is planned for June 14<sup>th</sup> at Ft Saskatchewan. #### Fly of the Month

Pattern: Stimulator

Hook: Size 8 to 14 - 2x

long

Thread: 8/0 orange
Tail: Elk Hair
Rib: brown, clipped
Body: Orange dubbing
Thorax: Yellow dubbing
Hackle Grizzly saddle



Comment: This month's fly is a staple for both spring and late season fishing. It can represent either a stonefly or a hopper. You can substitute material colors to suit the expected insect from black for the early Squallas to yellow and green for hoppers or if you're lucky, black and orange in big sizes for the salmon fly hatch.
