Jim has been with us before and shared many fishing tactics that many of us have put into practice. This year he shared with us new fishing strategies, his recommended fly patterns (both wet and dry) for Alberta, fly-casting techniques as well as sharing great tips on nature photography. We fish in many of Alberta's beautiful places so why not capture them by taking better photos to go with our memories. Jason Randall provided a lot of information from the latest scientific studies that he has been involved in as a fishing biologist and veterinarian. He shared with us what the fish see, the critical angle, window & mirror and how fish react to our presence in their surroundings. I found it very interesting when he shared with us that trout are visual predators and he listed the four prime search images that they use in obtaining food. Other topics were the refresher on reading moving waters, the percentages of the flow speed on the surface, along the banks, and at the bottom of the stream, where trout "hide" and the preferred feed lines which included audience participation. Thank you, to both Jim McLennan and Jason Randall for their great presentations and sharing with us their many skills, stories, and fishing knowledge. As we carry on through our winter doldrums the January seminar whets our fishing appetite as we wait for the ice to break up and start to move on our local rivers and lakes. I started tying a few of Jim's suggested patterns already. It was also encouraging to see a good number of new faces at this year's seminar; hopefully the local folks that attended the seminar will also come out to our club meetings to learn and share more fly fishing knowledge.

Stimulator



One of the 12 Essential flies Jim McLennan shared with us at the January seminar was the Stimulator.

Hook: TMC 200R #6-16
Thread: Danville Fire Orange 6/0
Tail: Natural Brown Elk Hair
Abdomen: Yellow dubbing

Abdomen Hackle: Ginger or Silver Badger Hackle,

Rib: <u>Fine Gold Wire</u>
Thorax: <u>Ginger Angora Goat Dubbing</u>
Wing: Natural Brown Bull Elk Hair

Thorax Hackle: Grizzly Hackle over thorax

I was fishing the upper Maligne River late last August and it was cold, raining and snowing the whole time (it's cold when you put your hands in the Maligne and the water feels warm). I made the decision to use nymphs

and landed /released a few 6-8"rainbows. I decided to give up fishing in the cold but just before leaving, while shivering, I tied on a Stimulator with shaky fingers and as soon as it hit the water I was immediately stimulated

by the sudden take of the fly by a 16" rainbow.
