From the Editor

We had an Exceptionally Mild Winter, and then February Warmed Up!

For the folks who did not get a chance to travel to the warmer climates of our planet this winter (like our Ken M. who sent us videos of sea turtles and related aquatic life while he was scuba/swimming in the Caribbean, thanks Ken) we have been very fortunate in Edmonton to experience warmer weather than normal. For example, temperatures hovered around 15 degrees Friday, Feb. 26, breaking a temperature record that's been held since 1938. The last time Edmonton saw comparable temperatures during the month of February was on Feb. 28, 2001, when the thermometer reached 12.9°C. By 4 p.m. Friday, Feb. 26, the Edmonton Blatchford weather station reported temperatures of 14.7°C. Not too shabby, hopefully some of our club members were able to get their fly rods out to the Red Deer or Stauffer Creek. As the increase in daylight hours leads to even warmer days it won't be too long before the ice will break up and we will be tossing the flies on our lakes and rivers. I wish I could include some fish photos, but we both got skunked -- not even a hit. However it was fun just to get out.".....Can't Wait!

The Green Rock Worm!


