Fall Club Meetings Begin on Wednesday September 14!

Interesting that during the first trip to Stauffer earlier in the season it appeared that the creek was going to run dry, the water level was extremely low. Another trip in August and the water levels were higher than I've ever seen. While fishing the Rocky Mountain House area during the later part of August all the lakes and rivers were in good shape water level wise which is good for the anglers and the fish.

More Whirling Disease Cases Found in Banff National Park

More cases of whirling disease have been found in Banff National Park — this time in the Bow River, elevating concerns for southern Alberta's fish populations. On Monday, the Canadian Food Inspection Agency announced that the contagious disease was confirmed Sept. 7 in fish taken from the Bow River.

"For some samples taken at about four or five sites downstream of Bow Falls, between there and the east park boundary, we have positive results for whirling disease," Bill Hunt, manager of resource conservation with Banff National Park, said in an interview Monday. "It indicates it's in the Bow River."

The first Canadian case of whirling disease — named after the circular swimming patterns of infected fish — was confirmed in Johnson Lake in Banff National Park. Johnson Lake remains closed, and restrictions were also put in place for other streams, rivers and lakes in Banff National Park.

Whirling disease can be spread by people or birds, and affects six species of coldwater fish found in Alberta: cutthroat trout, rainbow trout, mountain whitefish, brown trout, bull trout and brook trout. Both cutthroat trout and bull trout are listed as species at risk.

The fall programs will begin this Wednesday, *September 14th* with a bull session along with a discussion on what the members would like to see this year. On *September 21st* Brian Bleakley will discuss ways of obtaining donations for the Clubs Silent Auction in November followed by Denis Southwick tying the Non-Slip Ant, a very simple fly that catches fish. On *September 28th* Elton Hunter will give a presentation regarding Bear Sense Awareness.

CLUB MEETING PRESENTATIONS


